Since its founding in 1949, the Peninsula Sports Club has been an active force on the sports scene. The 1st Headliner's Night was held in 1950 and continues to recognize high school, college, and professional athletes, coaches and volunteers from local communities. In 1955 the first All-Peninsula football team was honored. In 1958, baseball, basketball and track were added.

The Club became involved in community projects, advocating a "civic center" which became the Hampton Coliseum, and was involved in bringing professional baseball back to the Peninsula in 1963. In 2012, we were proud to incorporate the PSC Foundation to enhance the Club and its offerings. The Club provides financial aid to high school athletes throughout the greater Peninsula area through the scholarship program and is active with many events throughout the Peninsula through our membership.

The goals of the Club have remained the same over the years, to identify and recognize Peninsula citizens who promote sport activities make outstanding contributions to perpetuate community athletics; and to recognize outstanding Peninsula athletes, many of whom have gained national acclaim. The Club continues to recognize and honor the successes of female and male high school and college athletes throughout the area.

EMCEE - JAY COLLEY



Jay Colley

One of the nation's longest-tenured college sports broadcasters, Colley has been a fixture of the Tribe's sports broadcasts for 40 years. During that impressive tenure, he has missed just three W&M football games, which was due to illness during the Tribe's 2010 playoff run.

Colley calls the play-by-play for the Tribe in football, basketball and select baseball game. Colley is also a veteran baseball commentator, who was previously the voice of the Rochester Redwings, the Richmond Braves, the Tidewater Tides and the Norfolk Tides. In recognition of Colley's years of service to the College, he was selected as an honorary alumnus of William & Mary and was officially presented with the honor at Charter Day in February, 2003.

Colley was a mass communications graduate of Middle Tennessee State University. In 2012, he received the W&M men's basketball program's Sixth Man Award for his hard work and dedication to the program. Jay and his wife Cindy have a daughter, Carleigh Danielle, who graduated from James Madison University, and a son, Benjamin William, who was an All-American swimmer at North Carolina.



Will Driscoll

Will Driscoll was born and raised in Norfolk, VA. A 2000 graduate of Maury High School, he attended Temple University in Philadelphia, and obtained a bachelor's degree in broadcast journalism. Following college, Will worked as a news and sports broadcaster for local television affiliates in Fairbanks, Alaska and Johnstown, Pennsylvania. He even stepped up to the plate and served as weather anchor in times of need. During his time in broadcasting, he won awards for his coverage of Alaska's 50th anniversary as a state, as well as for co-hosting The Zone, Johnstown's top Friday night high school football highlight show. Some of his favorite memories in broadcasting include covering a dog-sled race from a frozen river, laying eyes on the Arctic Ocean, and creating his Will the Thrill daredevil series featuring activities such as skydiving and police dog training.

After transitioning out of television, he obtained his master's degree in Sports Leadership from Northeastern University in Boston, MA. He then joined the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame in June of 2017 to lead its fundraising and marketing efforts, as the Hall began its transition from a museum platform to a brand-based platform focused on events, content, and programming. In February of 2019, Will was elevated to the position of Executive Director at the Hall.

During his time as Executive Director, Will has helped the Hall increase its scholarship awards to Virginia student-athletes, partnered with the Children's Hospital of the King's Daughters on sports and mental health focused initiatives, created a digital content platform the Hall Call Interview Series, and expanded the Hall's exhibit presence beyond the Southside of Hampton Roads.

Will aims to continue the Hall's mission of celebrating athletic excellence in Virginia while also highlighting how sports can be used as a platform to improve communities throughout the Commonwealth.

When he is not working on a Virginia Sports Hall of Fame project, you can find him spending time with his family, wife Katie, son Liam, and corgi Ollie. The beach or a golf course are always good places to look. He has plenty of great stories about Alaska golf, so just ask!

An avid sports fan, Will loves cheering on the Temple Owls, Boston Red Sox, Boston Bruins, Washington Football Team, Arsenal Football Club, and of course his 8-year-old son Liam.

Who are **THESE GUYS?**

Several Peninsula Sports Club awards are labeled, but not identified...

The **HERBERT MOREWITZ** Sports Person of the Year Award is presented in honor of the club's first president (1949) and an organization co-founder. He was tireless, generous and always optimistic. He spent untold hours coaching youngsters playing for his Hurricanes in the 1940s and 1950s, while also working with the Boys Scouts and Boys and Girls Club of the Virginia Peninsula for five decades until his death in 1997. His most successful venture was spearheading a drive that raised \$1.2 million in 1985 for the construction of a Boys Club building in Denbigh. He also engineered raising \$235,000 to assist in the opening of Peninsula War Memorial Stadium in 1948. No one else backed Peninsula minor league baseball as fervently or tried as diligently to return it here after its collapse in 1992.

The **JULIE CONN** Outstanding High School Male Athlete of the Year Award remembers the colorful, extremely successful Newport News High School athletic director and coach of virtually all sports. He was unequalled in track, and basketball for decades. He spent 56 years in the Newport News school system before mandatory retirement at age 65 in 1970. His basketball teams never missed a VHSL state tournament from 1927 to 1953. His Typhoon won 396 games and lost 77. In track, his tutelage led to 21 outdoor state championships. He was the Peninsula Sports Club's first Man of the Year in 1951 and was National High School Track Coach of the Year in 1958.

The **HENRY JORDAN** Award goes to a professional athlete who demonstrates high integrity and a positive attitude. Jordan is most known for his stellar 11-year career with the NFL's Green Bay Packers (1959-69) as a defensive tackle. He graduated from Warwick High School in 1953 and played collegiately at Virginia. He was a seven-time All-Pro selection and played on the first two Super Bowl champion teams and five NFL champions. He was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame and the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame.

The **CHARLES KARMOSKY** Award recognizes the community spirit which symbolized Karmosky's 38 years as sports editor of the Daily Press. The honor goes to a Peninsula Sports Club member for outstanding contributions to PSC activities. Karmosky was a founding member of the Club and its president in 1951. He was PSC Man of the Year in 1957, and was in the first class admitted to the media wing of Virginia State Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997.

Who are **THESE GUYS?**

Several Peninsula Sports Club awards are labeled, but not identified...

THAD MADDEN spent 28 years as the football, basketball and track coach at Huntington High School in Newport News. In 1971, he moved to Warwick High School and stayed until his retirement in 1981. He owned a 251-114-16 career record in football. In a four-year stretch at Huntington, his basketball teams went 112-13 and won three Virginia Interscholastic League Eastern District titles. In track, his Vikings won 198 state individual titles.

The **BOB MOSKOWITZ** Media Award is presented to the area media person for exemplary presentation of area sports. Moskowitz, a Sports Club President in 1961, logged over 50 years in journalism, and is in the Media Wing of the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame.

The **BETSY THOMAS** Outstanding High School Female Athlete of the Year Award is named for the long-time Lafayette High School athletic director, and James Blair High School field hockey and cheerleading coach. She was a pioneer in the advancement of girl's athletics in the state, and is co-founder of the Lafayette High School Hall of Fame. The 2016 Headliner's Event signifies the first year the Peninsula Sports Club named and presented this award in honor of Betsy Thomas.



David Teel

David Teel is the sports columnist for the Richmond Times-Dispatch. He joined the newspaper in 2020 after 36 years with the Daily Press, which to mark his 30th anniversary with the paper published a book of his best work, "*Press Pass*." Inducted into the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame in 2014 and the United States Basketball Writers Association Hall of Fame in 2017, he has been voted by his peers the Virginia Sportswriter of the Year a record 13 times. He has chronicled the Atlantic Coast Conference, dozens of college bowl games, 27 NCAA Final Fours, Super Bowl XLIII, U.S. Open golf, the 1996 Summer Olympics and more. Teel grew up in Baltimore, graduated from James Madison University in 1981 and still types with two fingers. His wife, Jill, is the family's most accomplished athlete and astute sports observer. The couple welcomed a daughter, Laura, in 2011.



Jason Bryant



For the last 27 years, broadcasting, announcing and writing has been a constant presence in Jason Bryant's life. Originally from Newport News, Bryant moved to Poquoson in 1992 and it was there where the passion for broadcasting and announcing became a common practice. In the late 1990s, it was impossible to go to a Poquoson sporting event and not see Bryant covering the event or calling the action over the PA system.

A 1997 graduate of Poquoson High School and a 2004 graduate of Old Dominion University in Norfolk, Bryant's Peninsula sports roots began with the Peninsula Poseidons, a popular semipro football team, in 1992. Two years later, as a freshman in high school, then-baseball coach George Yeager gave Bryant a shot on the mic.

But it was Poquoson's signature sport – wrestling – that helped take his career from Bull Island to the Olympics.

Bryant, while working for the Daily Press, first as a clerk, then as a copy editor and page designer, created Mat Talk Online, a Virginia-based wrestling website in October of 1997. That led to numerous announcing gigs around the state and eventually, the world. Bryant left Virginia in 2005 and since has worked for the National Wrestling Coaches Association, USA Wrestling and Amateur Wrestling News before rebranding and relaunching Mat Talk Online into the world's largest on-demand wrestling audio website. He's produced, edited and distributed nearly 3,000 podcast episodes. Bryant has either covered or announced 24 Virginia Duals, 45 different college national championships, 22 Junior National Championships, 16 World Championships, 16 World or Olympic Team Trials and now three Olympic Games.

A 2017 inductee by the Virginia Chapter into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame for Lifetime Service to Wrestling, Bryant has been the President of the National Wrestling Media Association since 2009. He resides in New Brighton, Minnesota with his wife Abby and two gold medal daughters – Lucy London (9) and Ruby Rio (5). While Minnesota is where he lives, the Peninsula will always be "home."





Jeff Johnson

A lifelong Peninsula native, Jeff grew up in the Fox Hill section of Hampton and his first recollection of any sports was going to the fast pitch softball games at Francis Asbury park. He spent most of his summer nights at the park as his dad was a long time member of the Fox Hill Recreation Association who oversaw the fast pitch team. Those teams were national powers and every Friday and Saturday night saw some of the best teams in the nation come to the small community of Fox Hill and the entire neighborhood would come out to loudly support the home team.

Many of those local players became idols of his and his childhood friends. He is humbled by the fact that he gets to serve on the Peninsula Sports Club board with one of those idols, Bud Porter, who was the longtime catcher of the softball team. Additionally, he was asked to become a member of the club by his former high school teacher, Ray Smith, who is now his regular golfing partner. To be a peer of Bud and Ray speaks volumes of how the sports club tries to nurture relationships to continue the good work that the it has been known for over the past seventy-one years.

With his Dad as his mentor, Jeff feels like giving back is important. That's why he was eager to become a member of PSC and its board. No job is too big or too small to help promote the values and vision of the sports club. He feels that the last seventy-one years of achievements of the club has provided a strong foundation for greater successes for the next seventy plus years. He is a strong believer in getting individuals and businesses to jump onboard to help move the club forward using the latest technology available.

A true sports fan, he plays golf as often as possible and loves following Old Dominion and Virginia Tech athletics as well as UNC basketball. He is active in his church and the Oyster Point Rotary Club. He and his wife, Mary, are the proud parents of two daughters, Jennifer Johnson and Katie Lawler, and her husband Thomas who are all three graduates of Virginia Tech.

Jeff is honored to receive the Charles Karmosky Award given to a sports club member for outstanding contributions to PSC activities. He feels that many members are equally deserving and is humbled to have been chosen as this year's recipient.



Phillip Smith, III

Phillip attended Huntington High School, where starred on the football team. He played varsity football as a freshman. He was running back with flashy moves and speed. He played football throughout his time at Huntington. He led Huntington to many VIA Championships from 1950 – 1955. He holds the school record for the most points scored in a one season

He attended Elizabeth City State Teachers College (ECSU) on a football scholarship. He had outstanding career at ECSTC and was captain of the football team in 1961. He lettered all four years at ECSTC. He also played a major role on the 1955-56 S.I.A.C. Championship Team. In 1969, Phillip led the team in rushing yardage, finishing the year in fifth in C.I.A.A., receiving ALL- Conference Honorable Mention.

Phillip coached at Westside High School in Smith field for 5 years, where he was Coach of the Year in 1965, 1967 and 1968, winning 3 State Championships.

In 1970, he became the first African American to be a Head Coach in the City of Newport News. He was the Head Coach at Denbigh High School for 5 years.

In 1975, he became the first African American to be a Head Coach in the City of Hampton. He was the Head Coach at Phoebus High School for 6 years.

Tajh Boyd

Boyd attended Phoebus High School in Hampton, Virginia. As a starter on the football team, he was 43–2 winning two state championships in that tenure. He was awarded the Pete Dawkins Trophy for being the co-MVP of the 2009 U.S. Army All-American Bowl after completing 7-of-9 passes for 179 yards and three touchdowns.


COLLEGE After being redshirted for the 2009 season, Boyd spent the 2010 season as the backup quarterback to Kyle Parker. He finished the season completing 33-of-63 passes for 329 yards with four touchdowns and three interceptions.

Boyd took over as the starter in the 2011 season. Boyd led the Tigers to a 10–4 record, winning the ACC Championship and setting up a game against West Virginia in the Orange Bowl. Although the Tigers lost the Orange Bowl in record fashion, 70–33, Boyd had a highly successful year. He finished the year completing 298-of-499 passes for 3,828 yards and 33 passing touchdowns. He also ran for 218 yards and five touchdowns. He was also mentioned as a possible 2012 Heisman Trophy candidate.

During his second year as a starter in the 2012 season, Boyd helped lead the Tigers to an 11–2 record, completing 287-of-427 passes for 3,896 yards, 36 touchdowns, and 13 interceptions. On November 17, 2012 in a game against NC State, he broke the ACC record for most touchdowns in a game. Boyd threw five touchdown passes and ran for three more, collecting eight total touchdowns and racking up 529 all-purpose yards. After the season, he was named the ACC Player of the Year and AFCA 1st team All-American.

In the 2012 Chick-fil-A Bowl game against the LSU Tigers, Boyd completed 36 of 50 pass attempts for 346 yards and two passing touchdowns as well as a rushing touchdown and was named the game's MVP.

As a senior in 2013, the Tigers went 11–2, with Boyd completing 283-of-413 passes for 3,851 yards, 34 touchdowns, and 11 interceptions. On November 14, 2013 Boyd set the ACC career passing touchdowns record. In his final collegiate game against the Ohio State Buckeyes in the 2014 Orange Bowl, Boyd helped lead the Tigers to a 40–35 victory, completing 31-of-40 passes for 378 yards and five passing touchdowns. He also had 127 rushing yards and a touchdown.[11] His performance set an Orange Bowl record for total yards in a game.[12] Boyd finished his career with school records for passing yards with 11,904 and passing touchdowns with 107. He is currently the all-time leader in both of those categories.





Kenia Cole


Kenia Cole enters her first season as the Tribe women's basketball assistant coach joining the program prior to the 2021-22 season. Cole comes to the Tribe after spending the last two years as an assistant at Hampton University. The Tribe's newest assistant is a three-time WBCA Thirty Under 30 honoree.

Cole has four years of experience on the bench, beginning with Oberlin College in the 2017-18 season when she helped the team take home their first ever North Coast Atlantic Conference Tournament Championship.

From Oberlin, Cole moved to Presbyterian College for the 2018-19 season. In her time in Clinton, S.C. Cole worked with the guards and helped Presbyterian to a conference championship quarterfinal appearance.

Most recently the Silver Spring, Md. native coached at her alma mater, returning to Hampton University prior to the 2019-20 season. During her first season at Hampton, the Pirates finished third in the Big South with a 14-6 record. Cole helped bring a defensive intensity to Hampton as the Pirates finished among the nation's best in defensive points per game and turnovers forced in the 2020-21 season.

As a player Cole was a staple in the Hampton backcourt all four years on campus before graduating in May 2015. On the floor she helped lead the Pirates to four MEAC regular season titles and three trips to the NCAA Tournament.

Danny Rhea

Danny Rhea basically was born and raised at Century Lanes in Hampton. He started bowling when he could pick up a ball and scored his first 200 game not long after. He showed an obvious affinity for the game, but he bowled enough to grow disenchanted for a few years, stop competing and try other sports. But his family knew Danny likely would find his way back to bowling — it's in his blood.

Over the course of his comeback, Danny, 11, has come five pins shy of scoring 300 to earn a perfect game. Recently, he scored his first 700 in a three-game series. He placed second in a statewide competition and is headed to Detroit for nationals this summer. In the fall comes another milestone — middle school.

Danny, who lives in Newport News, already has put together a formidable bowling career. When asked if he wants to go pro, his response is an assured, "Oh, yeah," as he pointed to the Professional Bowling Association patch stitched to his red jersey, which sits loose on his wiry frame. Summer gives Danny more time to hone his craft, and he spends plenty of time practicing. He has nearly unlimited access to the alley — his father, also named Danny, is a part owner, and the alley has been in the family since 1963. Danny enjoys having that connection to the alley, and he knows its history well, reciting facts about his great-grandparents, the original owners, and giving praise for the original maple wood lanes — a rarity nowadays.


Danny's prowess draws friendly comparison from the family to its other star bowler. "Danny's following in his uncle's footsteps," said his mother, Courtney Rhea. That uncle, Josh Garner, bowled a perfect game and had an 800 series in the same day when he was about Danny's age — at the time, he was the third youngest person to accomplish that feat, according to the Daily Press and Sports Illustrated.

Garner, a co-owner of Century Lanes, serves as a competitor and a coach to his nephew, said the older Danny Rhea. "(Josh) doesn't take it easy on him," he said. As Danny prepares for his trip to the USA Bowling National Championships later this month, bowling 20 games is about an average practice day.

As his grandmother Joan put it: "He'll bowl until the ball splits in half." This spring was only the second time Danny competed in the Virginia state youth championships, which operates under the United States Bowling Congress and drew 111 bowlers in the under-12 boys division. He knew he could be competitive, despite his lack of experience in that specific tournament. He said he expected to average games of about 180. Over six games, his average was about 213, landing him in second place for his age division.

There's deceptive power in Danny's slight frame. He employs a two-handed approach, like his uncle and Danny's favorite pro Jason Belmonte, winner of 22 PBA titles and a pioneer of the two-handed approach. That approach creates more spin and speed, resulting in satisfying crashes when the ball — all 14 pounds of it — meets the pins. More often than not, the result for Danny is a strike.

Along with the physical practice that comes with the sport, Danny's parents said he's analytical. At home, he can't practice, but he can watch videos of pros to break down their techniques. "I can't get him to play video games," his dad joked. When it comes to his own game, Danny has a similar attention to detail. Recalling his highest-scoring single game, he can provide the specifics of his performance. "It was right over there in lane seven. I didn't even realize I had a perfect game going until the seventh frame," he said. As he approached his last few frames, more and more people crowded around his lane to watch. "I was getting a little scared," he said with a laugh. He bowled a strike on the 10th frame and knocked down another 10 pins on his next ball. His last throw didn't follow suit. "I hooked it," he said, mimicking the ball's curved path with his arm. The final score was 295.





Dave Pulk

For a man who rediscovered his love of golf in his late 30's, Dave Pulk has put together a second part of his golf career that has had several highlights all of which happened after turning 40.

- One of two two-time winners of the Virginia Senior Golf Open (2015, 2019)
- Two-time Virginia Senior Golfer of the Year (2015, 2019)
- Mid-Atlantic Senior Amateur Champion
- Ohio Senior Amateur Champion
- Northeast Ohio Amateur
- Participated in two US Amateurs, one US Mid Amateur, four US Senior Amateur, one British Am, one British Mid Am and one British Senior Amateur.

He rediscovered his love of golf back in Ohio in his late 30's and counts the 2004 Northeast Ohio Amateur as a special moment. "I was very honored to have my name on the same trophy as my golf idol Arnold Palmer," he said.

He graduated from Kent State University summa-cum-laude with a B.B.A. double majoring in Economics and Business Management. He played golf for Kent State having grown up in Northeast Ohio. Currently he does some business consulting work after starting his career with a fortune 500 company.

With those accolades, you can add one more to that list – Peninsula Sports Club Special Achievement Award winner 2020-21.

I've not played well in this tournament. It's just fun to play well around your fellow peers."

At 63, Pulk continued his strong summer of play. He became just the second player to reach the final of the VSGA Senior Amateur and win the Senior Open of Virginia in the same year. (David Partridge won both events in 2011.) He also finished tied for sixth at the VSGA Senior Stroke Play Championship. He'll look to keep it rolling later this month at the VSGA Mid-Amateur and in early October at the VSGA Mid-Senior Amateur Championship.

"Hopefully it's a streak that will continue," Pulk said. "We'll see if I can contend a few more times before the season is over."



Elton Brown

Elton Brown enters his third season at The Apprentice School and will serve as the Offensive Coordinator in 2021 after also holding the titles of Offensive Line Coach, Recruiting Coordinator and Run Game Coordinator.



Since Brown's arrival two seasons ago, the Builders run game has made drastic improvements. Brown oversees a unit that has helped pave the way for the Builders offense that has averaged 36.3 points per game over the last two seasons combined. On October 26, 2019, Brown's unit helped the Builders offense set the single game rushing record (417 rushing yards) against Keystone College. In two seasons under Coach Brown's leadership the Builders have placed three offensive linemen on the All-USCAA Team (Keon Odom, Rodney Addison & Joey Mammano) and two linemen on The Apprentice School All-Decade Team 2010-2019 (Keon Odom & Rodney Addison). During the 2018 seasons the Builder's Offensive Line set another school record only giving up 12 sacks the entire 2018 campaign. The Builders followed up that season with another record breaking season only allowing seven sacks during the 2019 season.

Brown joined the Builders with eight years of coaching experience of various levels, which includes Offensive Line coach at Phoebus High School, Assistant Head coach/Offensive Line coach at Warwick High School, and Head Coach of the Diamond All-American Senior Game (2015-17).

Brown was selected with the 111th pick in the 2005 National Football League Draft by the Arizona Cardinals. Brown retired from the National Football League in 2010. Brown started the 1st & G.O.A.L. (Giving Opportunities at Life) Foundation (2005) in order to bring awareness to the importance of Education, Mentorship, Community Outreach & Fitness Awareness. To date the 1st & G.O.A.L. Foundation has organized Thanksgiving & Christmas Day feedings annually, Toy drives, Coat Drives, back to school events, adopt a classroom, speaking engagements, camps & plenty more.

Elton Brown was born in Newport News, Va. Elton was a two-year letterman in football, basketball and baseball at Heritage High School and lettered one year in football, basketball and baseball at Hampton High School. Brown accepted an athletic scholarship to the University of Virginia. On the field he was a team captain (2004) and also considered one of the top offensive linemen in school history, consensus first-team All-American as a senior. Elton was named first-team All-American by the American Football Coaches Association, the Walter Camp Football Foundation, Associated Press, The Sporting News, ESPN.com, SportsIllustrated.com, Rivals.com and CSTV. University of Virginia retired Brown's jersey on September 24, 2011.

Brown has been a pillar in his hometown and has been honored, by both the city of Newport News and the city of Hampton, for his charitable work in the community. Brown is the President and Co-Founder of Shutdown 757 youth organization. Shutdown 757's mission is to empower youth to reach their full potential through the core values of integrity, honor, and respect. Brown also serves as President of Shutdown 757.

Brown earned his bachelor's degree in anthropology from The University of Virginia and received his Master's Degree in Business Administration and a second Master's Degree in Criminal Justice from Saint Leo University.



One of many Jermaine Marrow goals as he started at Hampton University was to entrench himself in the record books among the elite to have worn the Pirates uniform. A senior season for the ages saw him become the all-time leading scorer not only in Hampton University history, but for Division I basketball in the State of Virginia with an impressive 2,680 points.

He ended third in NCAA Division I in scoring (24.8 ppg) and 11th in assists (6.5 apg) in 2020. Marrow averaged 28.7 points and 7.0 assists in the Big South Tournament to earn All-Tournament honors. His next to last game put him in rare air with 36 points and 10 assists against Radford, the only game of 35 or more points and 10 or more assists in any conference tournament game over the last 20 years.

He garnered plenty of post-season accolades being named to the BoxToRow All-American squad and the first two-time BoxToRow National Player of the Year in history. Marrow was a National Association of Basketball Coaches All District 3 selection, a Big South Conference First Team selection and Virginia Sports Information Directors First Team All-State honoree.

Marrow helped lead the Pirates to the Big South Conference Championship game in their second season in the conference finishing as a two-time First Team All-Big South selection.





Phillips Athletic Association



The Phillips Athletic Association (PAA) was incorporated in December 1974 and is a non-profit organization that provides recreational sports for the youth in Hampton. Over the past 46 years it has provided recreational sports such as soccer, baseball, basketball, futsal, football, and cheerleading. PAA is run totally by unpaid volunteers. The goal of the organization is to enable youth to have fun, provide recreation, learn the basics of the sport, socialize with peers having similar interests, learn teamwork, and develop positive values in a safe and structured environment. Many former participants in the organization have gone onto play their sport at the high school level and some even at the college level.

Currently PAA offers both spring and fall soccer. It is open to all males and females between the ages of 4 and 17. Typically there are about 500 to 600 players per season resulting in approximately 45 teams per season. Based on the number of players registered, the teams usually have a two year age span except for the oldest age group where the age span is larger. All the games are played in-house as opposed to against teams from other organizations making it easier for parents who have multiple children participating to transport them. The youngest participants play at Gosnold's Hope Park where PAA has provided 10 small goals and 3 full size goals for players who are a little older. The organization has also provided 4 full size goals at Syms Middle School, 4 full size goals at Phillips Elementary, and 1 full size goal at Jones Magnet Middle School. As with most organizations, PAA is always looking for volunteer coaches, especially in the older age groups so the organization can continue to provide sports for players of all ages.

They all have an outstanding record, exceptional accomplishments and a distinguished career in their sport.

RUDY HENDRICKS

Rudy has spent most of his adult life supporting the Fox Hill Athletics. He was involved in coaching football, basketball, and softball as well as serving the Fox Hill Athletic Association as an administrator and or commissioner for over forty years. Rudy has touched, in a positive way, the lives of many young girl and boy in Fox Hill.

DANNY MITCHELL

Since 1979, Danny has been a corner stone for Hampton High School football and baseball teams. In 1989, Danny and his Crabber supporters began building a baseball field so they could play on campus. The first game played there was in the Spring of 1990. This field was appropriately named the “Danny Mitchell Field” in April of 2018. As head baseball coach Danny earned one regional championship, 9 district championships, and three times named Regional Coach of the Year. In football, he earned two VHSL Assistant Coach of the Year awards and in 2008, Danny was inducted into the National High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame. Coach Mitchell, in 1999, with the assistance of Joe Trimble and Steven “Mo” Rivers started the Hampton Bombers, the first nine and under Amateur Athletic Union baseball team. They won three state championships over the next seven years. Coach Mitchell also initiated “Crabberween” a modified baseball game to raise funds and food for the community.

ROBERT WORTHINGTON

Robert served four years in the U.S. Army after graduating from college. He served in Vietnam where he was awarded two Bronze Stars and one Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry. In 1971, Robert started what he had dreamed about for years. For the next twenty-seven years Robert taught and coached. He was a pioneer in promoting girls’ basketball on the Peninsula. Retiring from coaching, Robert spent the next eighteen years as an Athletic Director, sixteen at Warwick and two at Denbigh before retiring completely. The past twenty years Robert has been on the RV circuit from Ohio to Florida.

SEWELL ROWLEY

Sewell was the first boys head basketball and head baseball coach at Tabb High School. He was very successful in both in spite of such challenges starting with no baseball field and starting in the Peninsula District competition. Sewell also coached the girls basketball team. Such athletes as Wayne, Terry, and Kenny Kirby made his job a little easier. An easy-going gentleman from the Eastern Shore, Sewell was a spark plug on the sidelines. After thirty-three years coaching and secondary administration he spent the next four years as Athletic director at Walsingham Academy. In 2013, Sewell was inducted into Legends of Tabb High School and his influence is still seen in their athletic programs.

Much of her time was spent trying to verify and maintain student eligibility and support the overall athletic programs. Involved in the daily operations of the Athletic Department, she also spent much of her time submitting bids for NCAA championship tournaments. Assisting with the induction of new members to the CNU Hall of Fame was one of her most gratifying. She helped many CNU students over these twenty-seven years.

HOWARD THOMAS

Howard spent three years in the U.S. Army after graduating from Kecoughtan High School where he was a baseball star. After the military, he went to Virginia Tech on a baseball scholarship and was very successful. He was named captain his senior year. Howard spent many hours over thirty-five years coaching youth softball and baseball. In addition to coaching he umpired softball and baseball for twenty-nine years at all levels. Highlights include umpiring ten Peninsula Pilots games. One was against the Russian Olympic Team and two against All Military All Star teams. In 2015 Howard was awarded "Lifetime Membership" Certificate in the Peninsula Baseball Umpires Association.

PAUL COWLEY

Paul spent the first two years of coaching boys basketball in the Hampton School system before moving to Newport News when Denbigh High was opened. He coached eight years at Denbigh facing the task of dealing with a new school opening. Then he moved to Warwick to be a full-time guidance counselor. However, their coach, Billy Taylor, became ill and once again Paul was back into coaching for another seven years. As a guidance counselor, Paul was able to not only help his players, but was most instrumental in guiding all the student athletes for their future.

BILL LYONS

A detailed, dedicated head football coach four years at York High School and thirteen years at Warwick earned his teams' 140 wins. One District Championship and one regional Runner-up at York and at Warwick, two Regional Championships, one Division five State Semi-finalist and one Division five State Runner-up. Prior to coming to the Peninsula, Bill was making his name known as a football coach in West Virginia and ended his Thirty- four year coaching career as an assistant at Christopher Newport University.

ALBERT E. MARROW, JR.

Al began his coaching career at Hampton University assisting John White the men's and woman's track and field coach and remained with them for ten years. He was instrumental with helping Hampton University win the Men's CIAA Championship and placing third in the NAIA Championship. He coached several NCAA All Americans while there. In 1988, Al became the head track coach at Kecoughtan High School. In his first year he successfully initiated the first girls' cross country team who placed fourth in the district meet and advanced five runners to their first regional cross country meet. He coached many outstanding girls and boys who were feared across the state for his relay teams in the 400, 200. And 1600 meters. Al also assisted with coaching football and had the pleasure of coaching Dwight Hollier formerly of the Miami Dolphins and Jerod Mayo of the New England Patriots. After thirty years of coaching, Al continues to mentor his former athletes, give motivational talks and advice to up and coming coaches.

Realizing that the young girls were coming to play varsity field hockey with few skills, she coordinated with the Newport News Parks and Recreation for developing beginners field hockey camps in 1986 during the summer. In 1988 Melanie again coordinated with the Newport News Parks and Recreation to form a summer field hockey league with York and Gloucester. A few years later this became a reality for in door programs in the winter. In addition to working with all these girls, she found time to work with her own children and sent two boys and a girl to play college athletics. It was great winning championships, but the thing I am most proud of is all the young girls' lives that I have had the opportunity to touch over the years.
